### Luke 1:39-55—Mary's Song of Trust

# I. The anxiety of the unknown (context found in *Luke 1:26-38*)

- a. Consider the process for Mary to take it all in
- b. Greatly troubled (v. 29) (perhaps world's biggest understatement)
- c. The 'normal' life she may have expected to have was turned upside down (sometimes we went to settle for less because it's safe when God has something bigger for us)

## II. Accepting the call (from anxiety to acceptance)

- a. Her journey moved from greatly troubled to 'may it be to me as you have said'; from anxiety to acceptance
- b. Acceptance does not equate to joyous enthusiasm; it's "okay, have it your way God."
- c. Her encounter with the angel and all the repercussions—she displayed trust, but we have to imagine some 'what-ifs' snuck into her thinking at certain times
- d. But any 'what-ifs' did not lead to doubtful disobedience; sometimes trust is not easy and may initially seem painful, but we try to take it

### III. The Journey of both the suffering and the grace

- a. When we journey with God, sometimes we have to hold in tension that experiencing God's grace (his work, his miracles, etc.) go hand in hand with discomfort and suffering
- b. Mary saw God at work in her life in a way that would bring awe while at the same time would involve challenges and even suffering
  - i. Immaculate conception in tandem with scandal
  - ii. Seeing God's miracle in her life while her fiancé seeks to divorce her
  - iii. Traveling while pregnant twice; seeing her elderly relative with child
  - iv. She would have faced loneliness, uncertainty, fear and yet also faced God

### IV. Adoring the Lord (from acceptance to adoration)

- a. Perhaps Elizabeth's words (vv.42-45) influenced Mary's perspective on her situation
- b. In the midst of seeing God at work even in the pain and misery of life; Mary was moved to worship
- c. Focus is on what God has done and is doing
  - i. How he uses the humble (like Mary) (but are available)
- d. Focus on ultimate justice
  - i. Even in the midst of her world of injustice, because she saw God at work, she knew this God can complete these tasks
  - ii. God's promises and plans will be carried out
- e. Can your soul glorify the Lord even in the midst of uncertainties and struggles because you can see God at work in the midst of them?
