

Fourth of July (Early)

Hybrid 49 days Indeterminate



You could have luscious vine-ripened fruit as early as the Fourth of July! The indeterminate plants produce a plentiful harvest of red 4 oz. tomatoes all season.

Siberia



The productive 'Siberia' tomato plants produce very early in the season due to its ability to set fruit in cool temperatures where other varieties will not. Reportedly, it is capable of setting fruit down to 38°F, however, 'Siberia', like any other tomato, is not actually frost hardy. They are bright red, globe shaped, and weigh up to five ounces each. (50 days, determinate)

Mortgage Lifter (Beefsteak)

Heirloom 80 days Indeterminate



This huge heirloom beefsteak averages over 2lb. and consistently wins taste-tests. Developed in the '30s by a gardener who cross-pollinated the biggest varieties he knew for six seasons and created a variety that produced immense, tasty fruit.

Brandywine Pink (Beefsteak)

Heirloom 80-90 days Indeterminate



Ranked first in many taste tests! Brandywine sets the standard for the rest. You will love it on sandwiches, in salads, on relish trays, or as a meal all by itself! Produces large fruit up to 1.5 lbs. Brandywine will win your taste test.

Luella Linder Paste (Beefsteak/Paste)

Heirloom Indeterminate



This beefsteak "paste" variety is the result of decades of saving seeds by Luella Linder, one of Beech's life-long members. It grows very large (up to 2 lbs.), is delicious and very meaty with very little pulp and few seeds. Seeds were saved from a 2 lb tomato grown by former pastor Dan King in 2017.

Pruden's Purple (Beefsteak)

Heirloom 75 days Indeterminate



An old favorite, beautiful pink-red, 8 oz. to 1 lb. fruits on productive plants. Blemish free, split resistant, great flavor, possibly superior to Brandywine. More disease resistance than most heirlooms.

Mennonite (Beefsteak)

Heirloom 80-days Indeterminate



A large mid-season yellow/orange beefsteak tomato. The fruit is juicy and sweet.

Mr. Strihey



Red and yellow-striped heirloom variety that adds color to any gourmet salad bar. Large, ridge-shouldered beefsteak fruits are mild-flavored and low in acid.

Indeterminate (80 days)

Golden Jubilee

Mild flavor and low acidity make this one of the best



varieties for tomato juice. Bright, golden-orange fruits, 2-1/2 to 3" in diameter average 6 to 7 oz. each and have meaty, thick walls. Fruits are solid, with few seeds. Medium-sized plants need staking, and produce high yields, making them ideal for home garden or fresh market. Indeterminate. (72 days)

Eva Purple Ball (Slicer)

Heirloom 70-80 days Indeterminate



This medium-sized tomato is a favorites for taste. It combines a rich flavor with beautiful color and blemish-free skin. An old heirloom from the Black Forest region of Germany, this tomato is very productive and deserves a place in every garden.

Palestinian (Oxheart)

Heirloom 85-90 days Indeterminate



From Palestine, Ohio. Seed was first offered in Seed Savers 1986 Yearbook by Nick and Alice Rini of Ohio. Indeterminate, regular leaf plant with wispy foliage produces, huge, red, blunt, heart-shaped fruit.. Excellent flavor, very meaty but also deliciously juicy flesh, few seeds, excellent for drying or fresh eating, or sauce. Blossom end rot resistant.

Hungarian Heart (Oxheart)

Heirloom 80 days Indeterminate



Brilliant reddish-pink oxheart type fruits are large, up to one pound! The fruits are firm and meaty like all oxheart types—great for paste, canning or fresh use. The crack-resistant fruits contain very few seeds and show little tendency to develop cores. Originated outside of Budapest, Hungary around 1900.

Calabretta (Paste)

Heirloom Indeterminate



An Italian heirloom paste-type tomato, large and elongated form.

Amish Paste (Paste)

Heirloom 80 days Indeterminate



Many seeds savers believe this is the ultimate paste tomato. Giant, blocky Roma-type tomatoes have delicious red flesh that is perfect for paste and canning. World class flavor and comes from an Amish community in Wisconsin.

Roma (Paste)

Heirloom 78 days Determinate



Roma is the classic Italian type. Big crops of bright scarlet, plum-shaped fruits, meaty with few seeds. Best choice for paste, canning and sauce. This is an easy to grow plant that is determinate

Riesentraube (Red Cherry)



An old German heirloom available in Philadelphia by the mid-1800s. Sweet, red one-ounce fruit grow in large clusters; the name means “Giant bunch of grapes” in German. These have a rich, full tomato flavor that is missing in many of today’s cherry types. Large yields. (75-85 days)

Yellow Pear (Cherry)

80 days Indeterminate



Very sweet, 1 1/2" yellow, pear-shaped fruit have a mild flavor and are great for fresh eating or for making tomato preserves. Very productive plants are easy to grow.

Blue Gold Berries (Cherry)

Heirloom 80 days Indeterminate



Beautiful cherry type in purple and yellow. Long clusters of small, 1/2-1 in. deep yellow/gold cherry fruits with dark indigo shoulders. Sweet & rich, crack resistant, and the fruits hold well on the vine or in storage.

Farthest North



'Farthest North' plants produce early and abundantly, even in cool weather. Its cherry-type fruit are small, one to two ounces each, red in color, globe-shaped with a nice, full flavor. (40-50 days)

California Wonder (Sweet)

Heirloom 75 days



An excellent green bell pepper, ripening to red. Nice size and good yield. A popular old-time variety.

Canary Bell (Sweet)

Hybrid 70 days



Medium-sized, thick-walled green Fruit ripening to bright yellow color. Sets early and produces all summer. Superb in salads, and a premier type for grilling. Exceptional flavor, very productive two-foot plants.

King of the North (Sweet)

Hybrid 68 days



Heavy yields of good-sized peppers. The variety thrives in the cooler summer weather so prevalent in New England and yields crisp bells, green ripening to red, right up until frost.

Orange Bell (Sweet)

Hybrid



Sweet, brilliant orange fruit is blocky and good-sized with thick flesh that is very flavorful.

Sweet Banana Pepper



Sleek, tapered fruit that reaches 6 to 7 inches long and 2 inches wide. Superb in salads, stuffed, pickled and more. 60 days

Habanero Pepper (HOT)



The fruit of 'Habanero' peppers are about one inch long by one inch across, have thin crinkled flesh, are light green in color as they are developing and ripen to orange-red. Although they are very hot, unlike other peppers touted for their heat, they are also flavorful. 'Habanero' peppers are used to add heat and flavor to recipes, jellies, sauces, chocolates, and more! (85 days)

Hungarian Hot Wax Pepper



Also called 'Hungarian Yellow Wax' or 'Hot Banana'. The fruit reach five inches long, are tapered, firm, yellow, waxy, and hot. The plants are dwarf, bushy, fourteen to sixteen inches tall, and are quite productive. They are pleasantly hot, not painful, generally reach somewhere between 5,000 and 15,000 Scoville Units, but remain quite flavorful. (65 days)

Eggplant Rosa Bianca



An Italian heirloom variety, this plant yields medium-sized fruit, measuring 5-8 inches in length. The fruit are oval in shape and feature a light pink hue, with some exhibiting creamy white shading. They are known for their meaty texture and mild flavor, which is notably free from bitterness. (75-90 days)

Eggplant Kamo



A gourmet eggplant, highly regarded by top chefs in Japan, plants are super heat and humidity tolerant. A Kyo Yasai or traditional vegetable of Kyoto, this variety is specifically from the city of Kamo, Japan. It is considered a regional delicacy of the area thanks to its creamy, dense flesh and sweet flavor. Eggplant began to be cultivated in Japan in the 8th century, and much effort in breeding and refining has been put in since its introduction! (65-80 days)
